## Announcing the LAKERS!

Lyme Central School proudly rebrands the District as....the LYME LAKERS!

During the past year the district began work on changing and replacing the district logo/mascot. The decision to make a change was indeed a difficult one, albeit an unfavorable one by some. However, given the facts regarding the need to incorporate a more suitable branding for the district based on much information received from NYSED Commissioner of Education, and several Native American entities, the choice was clear. It was time for a change.

The community was invited to participate in public informational meetings, BOE meetings, and a survey to offer suggestions for a new logo/mascot. Information was posted to the district website, including videos from the Native American Council detailing their views on being seen as a mascot. After compiling the many suggestions received from the survey, our LCS stakeholders voted to select a new logo – the *Lyme Lakers*.

From that point, an art contest was held for anyone interested in submitting a drawing to depict the new logo. Many talented people, young and old, submitted their art projects. The submissions were narrowed down by a logo selection committee, and another public survey was launched to vote for the new district logo. The winner of the contest was, LCS 10<sup>th</sup> Grade student, Henry Brennen! Henry submitted a golden anchor draped with a green banner with the word **Lyme** on the banner, and the word **Laker** under the bottom of the anchor. The logo will be sent to a graphic designer to create it as a graphic which will be used on district letterhead, clothing/merchandise, etc. A mascot design will be selected in the near future.

# Notes from the Nurse Justine Dowe, RN

Parents and Guardians,



It is sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school or keep them home due to illness. The following are a few suggestions to consider when determining to keep your student home, and possibly contacting your health care provider.

- ♣ Persistent fever greater than 100.4° including a fever that requires control with medication, like Tylenol
- ♣ Child is too sleepy or ill from an illness, like vomiting and/or diarrhea, to benefit from sitting in class all day
- ♣ Significant cough that makes a child feel uncomfortable or disrupts the class
- ♣ Sore throat that is severe, accompanied by fever and/or feeling ill, that persists longer than 48 hours, OR after known exposure to a confirmed case of Strep throat
- A Rash accompanied by other symptoms of illness such as fever
- A Red, runny eyes that distract the child from learning
- ♣ Large amount of discolored nasal discharge, especially if accompanied by facial pain or headache
- ♣ Severe ear pain or drainage from the ear
- Severe headache, especially if accompanied by fever
- Any condition that you think may be serious or contagious to others


