#### 8. Board Action:

**BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Lyme Central School Board of Education takes action to approve, by roll call vote, the resolution regarding the formation of the **Lyme Rod and Gun Trap Shoot Club** as follows:

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has advised the Board of Education that she has received community and/or student requests to form a school trapshooting club, which will enable its members to compete against other schools with trapshooting teams/clubs; and

WHEREAS, trapshooting is an exciting and challenging sport with several million participants which is growing in popularity throughout the United States and New York; and

WHEREAS, trapshooting has gained international recognition; and

WHEREAS, trap shooting is one of the recognized Olympic shooting sports, introduced to the Olympics program in 1900; and

WHEREAS, trapshooting has been a sport in America since 1831; and

WHEREAS, interest in the sport of trapshooting has grown to the point that New York has now formed a New York State High School Clay Target League ("NYSHSTL") to facilitate and promote students' participation in the sport of trapshooting; and

WHEREAS, the Amateur Trapshooting Association ("ATA"), the primary governing body of American trapshooting and the NYSHSTL both award scholarships to college-bound trap shooters based on academics, integrity, and marksmanship; and

WHEREAS, trapshooting is a coeducational sport capable of being participated in by students with disabilities, therefore making it compliant with Title IX and the Americans with Disabilities Act; and

WHEREAS, the goal of forming a trapshooting club would be to provide instruction and promote firearm safety, personal responsibility, and sportsmanship among the participants, and to enable students of both genders and those with disabilities to engage in competition against their peers across both New York State and the United States; and

WHEREAS, the formation of a trap shooting club would be compliant with the New York Safe Act and the Federal Gun Free Schools Act, in that at no time would firearms or ammunition be brought onto the Lyme Central School District campus as a result of the formation of a trapshooting club, or one of the District's students becoming a member of such a team/club; and

WHEREAS, the Lyme Central School District has been advised that per the rules of the NYSHSTL, the formation of a trapshooting club can be achieved at no cost to the District, and that club members and coaches would be covered under insurance provided by the NYSHSTL, also at no cost to the District and all

insurance policies shall name the Lyme Central School District as additionally insured and all forms shall reflect that; and

WHEREAS, the Board being fully apprised of the process to form a school trapshooting club under the NYSHSTL, and being desirous of the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lyme Central School District Board as follows:

- Section 1. The formation of a school trapshooting club pursuant to the rules of the New York State High School Trapshooting League is hereby approved.
- Section 2. The club's use of the school's name in forming and identifying said club is likewise hereby approved. For competition purposes, the club shall be identified as the Lyme Central Trapshooting Team.
- Section 3. The members of any such club shall be subject to the Lyme Central School District's Code of Conduct and any other policy or procedure applicable to student participation in extracurricular activities.
- Section 4. It shall be emphasized to any student seeking to join the trapshooting club and/or any student who becomes a member of the trapshooting team/club, as well as in any policies or procedures adopted as a result of the formation of the District's trapshooting club that students are to be fully compliant with the New York Safe Act and the Gun Free Schools Act, i.e., that at no time are firearms or ammunition to be brought on the Lyme Central School District campus.
- Section 5. The Superintendent and/or their designee are authorized to execute any documents necessary to form a school trapshooting club under the NYSHSTL.
- Section 6. The Superintendent and/or their designee shall have the authority to seek sponsors in support of the formation of a school trapshooting club, subject to the limits on commercial speech in schools as determined by the Commissioner of Education.
  - Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### 9. **Board Action:**

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Lyme Central School Board of Education takes action to approve, by roll call vote, the **Real Property Tax Resolution** as follows:

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the following resolution was offered by Kathy Dyer, and seconded by Terry Countryman, to wit:

WHEREAS, Section 487(2) of the New York State Real Property Tax Law as enacted prior to December 31, 2017 authorizes an exemption from real property taxes for certain alternative energy projects, including a solar energy system, wind energy system, or a farm waste energy system approved in accordance with the provisions of section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law;

WHEREAS, Section 487(2) of the New York State Real Property Tax Law as amended and effective on and after January 1, 2018 authorizes an exemption from real property taxes for certain alternative energy projects, including a solar energy system, wind energy system, farm waste energy system, micro-hydroelectric energy system, fuel cell electric generating system, micro-combined heat and power generating equipment system, electric energy storage equipment, and electric energy storage system approved in accordance with the provisions of section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law;

WHEREAS, Section 487(8) of the New York State Real Property Tax Law also provides that, notwithstanding the authorized exemption, a board of education of a school district may adopt a resolution to provide that no such exemption shall be applicable within its jurisdiction with respect to any energy generation or storage system constructed subsequent to the effective date of such resolution;

WHEREAS, this Board has determined that no such exemption should be applicable within its jurisdiction with respect to any energy generation or storage system constructed in accordance with the provisions under section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law as identified above subsequent hereto;

WHEREAS, this Board has determined it to be in the District's best interests to adopt a resolution declaring that no exemption under Section 487 of New York's Real Property Tax Law with respect to any energy generation or storage system constructed in accordance with the provisions under section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law shall be applicable within its jurisdiction.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> This Board hereby declares that, pursuant to New York State Real Property Tax Law 487(8), no exemption under New York State Real Property Tax Law 487(2) shall be applicable within its jurisdiction with respect to any energy generation or storage system constructed in accordance with the provisions under section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law constructed after the effective date of this resolution.

<u>Section 2.</u> Upon adoption of this resolution, the District Clerk is hereby directed to file copies of this resolution with the President of the New York State Energy and Research Development Authority, the New York State Tax Department Office of Counsel, and the County's office of Real Property Tax.

# Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
