## Resolution of the Board of Education of the Lyme Central School District Opting In To The Tax Exemption Under Real Property Tax Law Section 487

**WHEREAS,** Real Property Tax Law Section 487 allows school districts to opt out of the Tax Exemption granted to certain types of renewable energy facilities; and

**WHEREAS,** the Lyme Central School District (the "District") has previously opted out of Section 487, thereby rendering said facilities fully taxable; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Education is reconsidering the opt out from Section 487, in light of solar energy systems projects proposed by NSF Chaumont Site 1, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 2, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 3, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 4, LLC, and NSF Chaumont Site 5, LLC; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Education has determined that it is the best interest of the District to opt back in to Real Property Tax Law Section 487, granting a tax exemption to said projects.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Education of the Lyme Central School District, as follows:

1. The Lyme Central School District hereby revokes its right to opt out of Section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law authorizing said facilities covered by said laws to be tax exempt in accordance with said section.

2. A copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the President of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority and the Office of Real Property Services.

3. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

# Resolution of the Board of Education of the Lyme Central School District Authorizing Payment-In-Lieu-Of-Taxes Agreements and Education Contribution Agreements with NSF Chaumont Site 1, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 2, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 3, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 4, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 5, LLC.

WHEREAS, NSF Chaumont Site 1, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 2, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 3, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 4, LLC, and NSF Chaumont Site 5, LLC (collectively, the "Companies") has each proposed a solar energy systems project, with NSF Chaumont Site 1, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 3, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 4, LLC, and NSF Chaumont Site 5, LLC's projects consisting of approximately five (5) megawatts ac of electric power; NSF Chaumont Site 2, LLC's project consists of approximately three (3) megawatts ac of electric power; and all five projects are located on certain real property in the Lyme Central School District (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law, the District is authorized to enter into Payment-In-Lieu-of-Taxes ("PILOT") Agreement with parties constructing facilities eligible for a tax exemption under said section; and

**WHEREAS**, each Company has additionally offered to donate funds to the District to provide further financial benefits to the District in the form of an Education Contribution Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Education of the Lyme Central School District, as follows:

1. The Board of Education finds that it is in the best interest of the District to enter into PILOT Agreements with NSF Chaumont Site 1, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 2, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 3, LLC, NSF Chaumont Site 4, LLC, and NSF Chaumont Site 5, LLC and hereby authorizes the President of the Board of Education and the Superintendent of the Lyme Central School District to take all necessary steps to execute each PILOT Agreement.

2. The Board of Education hereby approves the Education Contribution Agreements and authorizes the President of the Board of Education and the Superintendent of the Lyme Central School District to take all necessary steps to execute each Education Contribution Agreement.

3. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

1. The District hereby invokes its right to opt out of Section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law and the tax exemption granted by said section.

2. A copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the President of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority and the Office of Real Property Services.

3. This resolution shall be effective immediately.
